Sample student response:

"The founders of a new colony, whatever Utopia of human virtue and happiness they might originally project, have invariably recognized it among their earliest practical necessities to allot a portion of the virgin soil as a cemetery, and another portion as the site of a prison" (Hawthorne 55-56).

Hawthorne immediately informs the reader of the utopian impulse of the Puritan project in the Boston colony he describes, simultaneously and ironically noting the inevitable impediment to such an enterprise: human depravity.
