A. Metaphor

\_\_\_\_\_ “Didn’t he fight to defend himself?” “No. He was not angry. He was just - not afraid. I have never seen anyone so completely not afraid.”

B. Understatement

\_\_\_\_\_ “There was no room for such weakness. He raised the anvil and struck the softened metal, blow after powerful blow, beating out his weakness...He would get rid of this flaw in himself!”

C. Extended metaphor

\_\_\_\_\_ “God will send us another David.”

D. Allusion

\_\_\_\_\_ ““Hate does not die with killing. It only springs up a hundredfold. The only thing stronger than hate is love.”

E. Foreshadowing

F. Symbolism
