<p>Literary Devices</p>	<p>Onomatopoeia – the wind hissed, spat, was crackling; the thunder rumbled</p> <p>Imagery: Metaphor: “The sea became a wildcat...”(11) Simile: Phantom ran “like the sea mews that soared overhead.”(151) Personification: “the galleon shuddered” The ship has “ribs”(11) and “bones”(11, 23)</p> <p>Anthropomorphism – ascribing human qualities to animals Ie: Misty speaks (158)</p> <p>Symbolism: the ocean symbolizes nature free and untamed</p> <p>Foreshadowing: Bob Watson’s boy was the first to try and gentle a wildhorse – unsuccessfully (37) “...even in her gentleness there was a wilding look in her eye, as if only her body...”(150)</p>
