READING QUIZ: The Bronze Bow

His hands unclenched and let her fall. Shamed, he stood back" (234).

Daniel's bitterness flares at the thought of a Roman entering his house and defiling his sister. Yet his anger does not further his vendetta against the Romans nor wound his enemies in the slightest. Rather, it destroys the one he loves.
