READING QUIZ: The Scarlet Letter

Choose a passage from today's reading assignment and write a 3-sentence quotation that discusses the thematic significance of character development in the story. Remember, a 3-sentence quotation includes the following elements:

- A "set-up sentence," which describes the situation in which the quotation occurs and makes brief reference to the prompt, question, or assignment,
- A direct quotation from the story, enclosed in quotation marks and followed by author/page-style citation at the end of the sentence but before final punctuation, and

But it was a remarkable attribute of this garb, and, indeed of the child's whole appearance, that it irresistibly and inevitably reminded the beholder of the token which Hester Prynne was doomed to wear upon her bosom. It was the scarlet letter in another form; the scarlet letter endowed with life! The mother herself...had carefully wrought out the similitude; lavishing many hours of morbid ingenuity to create an analogy between the object of her affection and the emblem of her guilt and torture. But, in truth, Pearl was the one as well as the other; and only in consequence of that identity had Hester contrived so perfectly to represent the scarlet letter in her appearance. (Hawthorne 103)

Though a constant reminder of Hester's shameful indiscretion, Pearl, the object of her mother's fierce affection, likewise embodies the comfort of God's consoling grace.
